Rainwater Harvesting in Houston

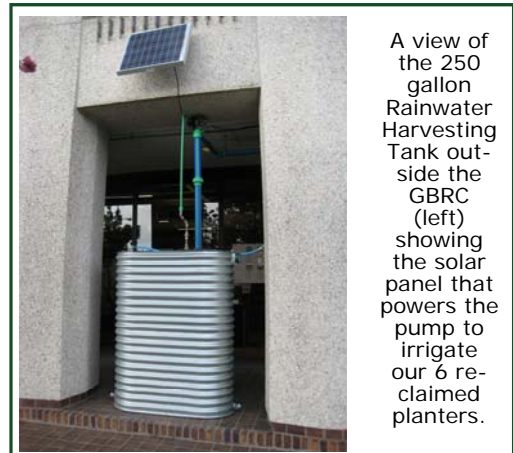
